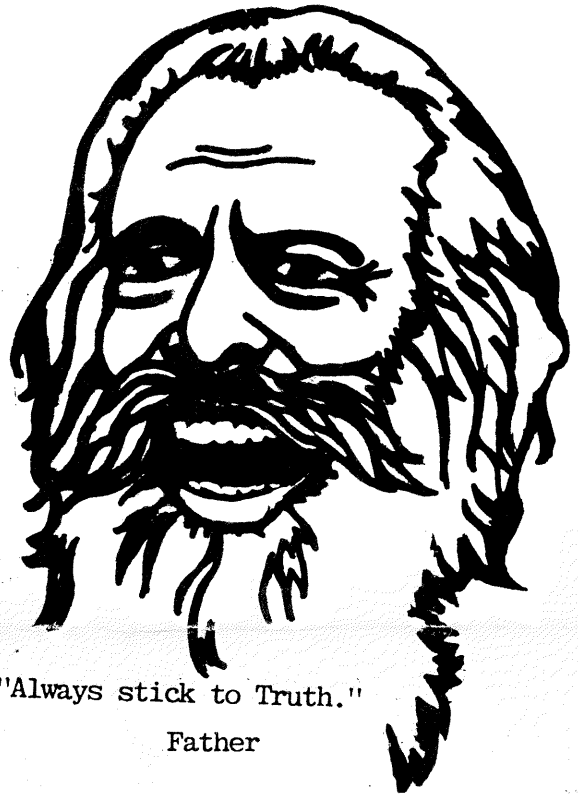

SIVA KALPA PARTY ENTERS LOCAL POLITICS -- ENDORSES TERENCE HALLINAN FOR SUPERVISOR!

The members of the San Francisco family have joined Charlotte Wallace, President of The Foundation of Revelation, in support of Terence Hallinan for City Supervisor from District Five.

The new district election of Supervisors represents a positive change toward intelligent, responsive government in San Francisco. The Real School of Siva Kalpa is in its 12th year, a good time to materialize a flash or two from the past few years! One such vision is that of a school-within-a-school -- unseparated from our family of teachers and home environment -- to serve our young "school-age" gods and goddesses. We cannot consciously send our children to a system of public education that not only has no idea of what Knowledge is, but has lost its feeling for children. We can provide a conscious alternative.

The Family in agreement, the project began. Steph, Pam, Wendy, Marilyn and Yamouna worked with me to set up a structure that would provide regularity without routine. We meet from 1-4pm, Monday through Thursday, and watch what happens when different ages (5-12) and learning levels are mixed in one room. The "frontier schoolhouse" is at 65 Scott #1, an ideal home base, cheerful and roomy enough to let groups spread out their art projects and games, rehearse around the piano, or study by the fireplace. Moreover, the room serves as a child/parent resource center, with a growing supply of books and toys.

Classes also meet all over the Village, from the beginning ABC's at Judy's, Pam's or Wendy's, to bellydancing at Sandy's on Page St., sewing at Nancy's on Waller, and yoga with Debbie on Hayes. There are many ways to plug into this scene (e.g., if you're unsure about teaching, arrange a field trip). I'm thinking of our family outside San Francisco as well, and if any of the other Foundation Centers need more information, please write. Bom Shankar Bholenath!
